## **Course Details**

Content in the Capstone in CTE course dependents upon the individual student's career goals. This course provides students an avenue for individualized learning, specific to a program area, to fulfill one or more of the following:

- Obtaining a relevant industry certification.
- Mastering essential skills determined critical by local industry.
- Developing skills within new and emerging fields.
- Completing the CDE defined capstone project as determined by the school district graduation guidelines. Note: This capstone
