

IT Clinical Internship

Level 4: Student explored previously; third or higher pathway specific course

Pathway(s): Networking Systems & Security

Description

IT Clinical Internship is a capstone course and work-based learning experience designed to provide students with real-world application of skills and knowledge obtained in previous Networking Systems courses. Students are eligible to take the IT Clinical Internship if they have successfully completed all the prerequisites in the Networking Systems program of study. The internships are designed to be completed in an IT Support environment, such as the student's school, a community-based shop that provides IT Support, or the IT Support department of a local business. This course puts to practical use all of the skills attained in previous courses, and provides the student with valuable hands-on experience.

Student Learning Outcomes

- 1) Identify career goals and how the WBL experience supports these goals.
- 2) Develop a training plan that specifically outlines technical skills with their supervisor/employer.
- 3) Agree to a supervisor/employer and school approved safety agreement.
- 4) Document hours, responsibilities, and learning that occurs within the WBL experience.
 - a. Achieve a minimum of 30 contact hours with industry
- 5) Receive formal, period evaluation from the supervisor/employer that is shared and stored at the school.
- 6) Reflect on and/or revise their career plan based on the WBL experience.
