Course Name	Introduction to Healthcare for Middle School
Course Description	This is the first course of three middle school CTE courses that introduce students to different areas of health-related careers. In this first course, students will learn about the history, structure, and legal issues of health-related careers and the healthcare system.
Note:	This is a suggested scope and sequence for the course content. The content will work with any textbook or instructional resource. If locally adapted, make sure all competencies are covered.
Schedule:	This is a 6-9 week course to be utilized in a middle school exploratory program. 60% of instruction time should be geared toward meeting the course competencies in this scope document. The remaining 40% of the instructional time allows for guest speakers, student presentations, field trips, remediation, or other content topics.
